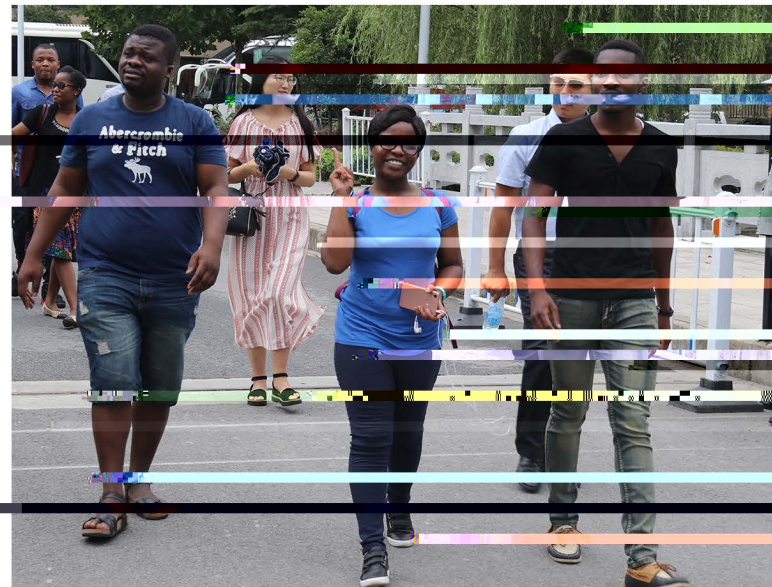

Prof. Jing Gao

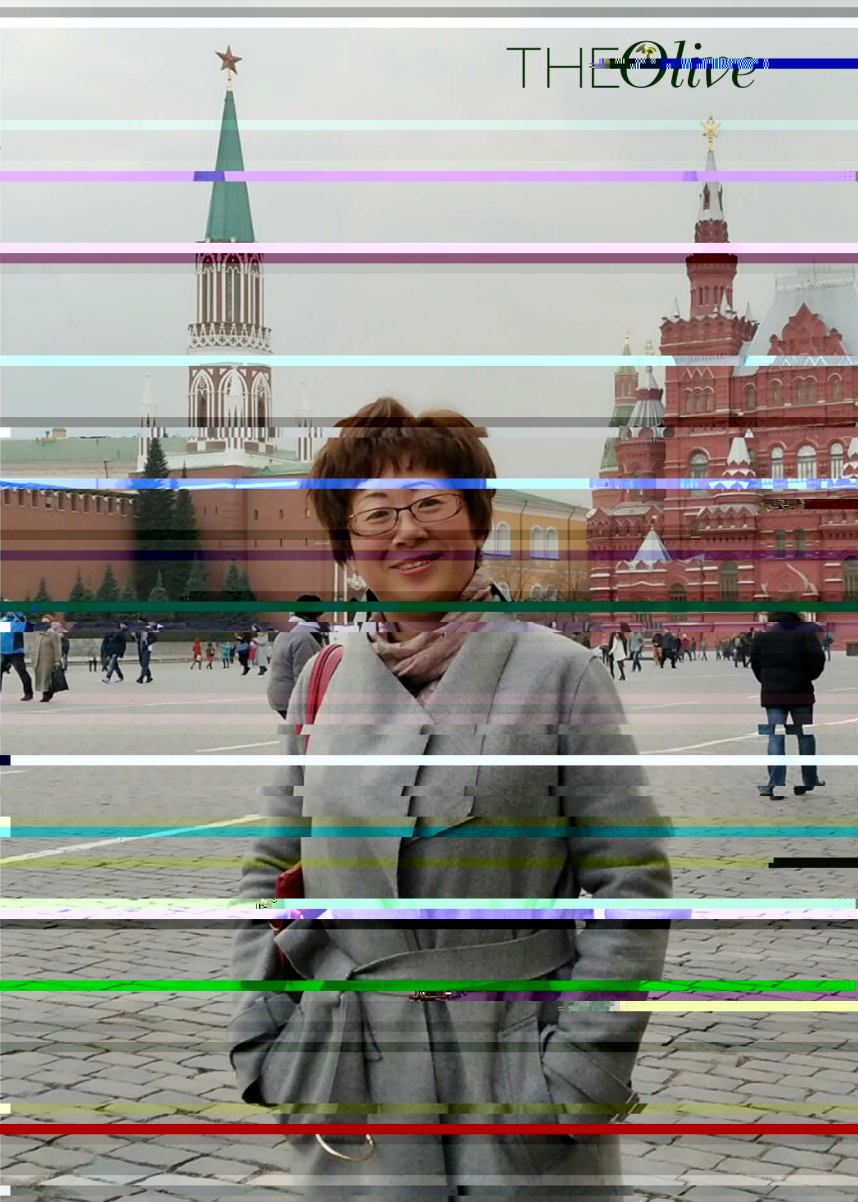

SIMULATED INTERNATIONAL CONFERENCE COMMUNICATION CONTEST

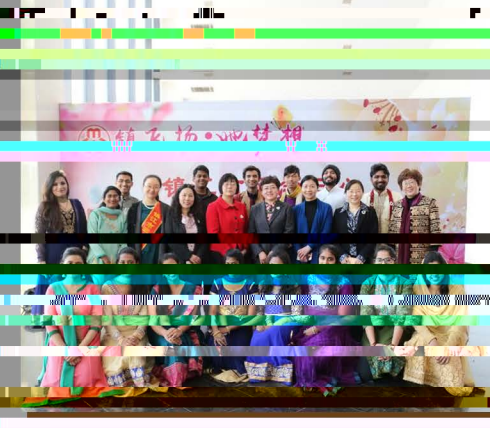
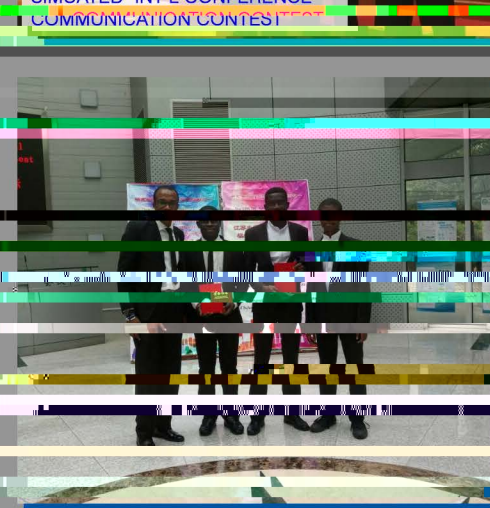
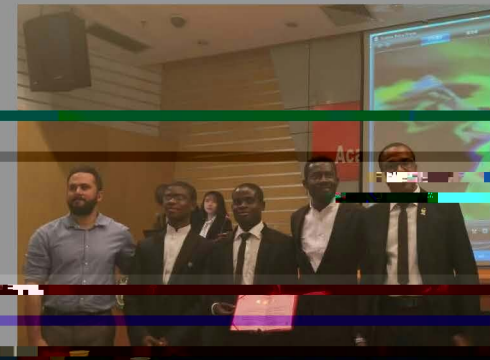
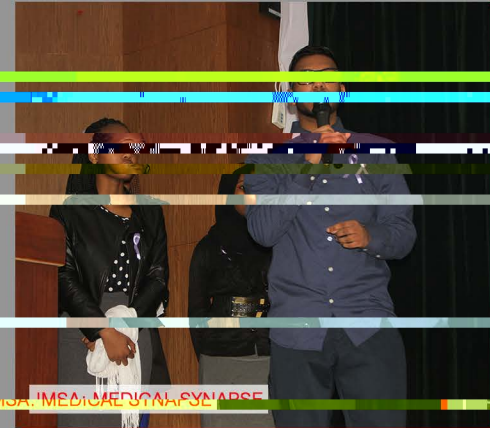
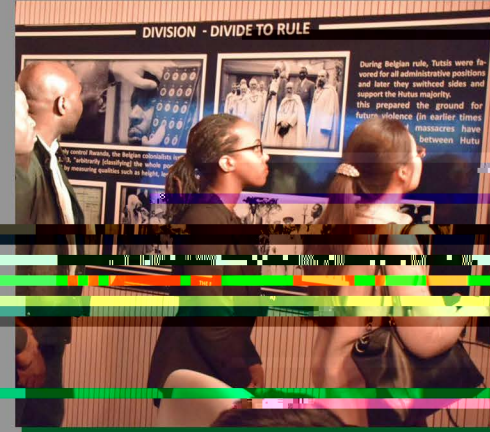

CRICKET TOURNAMENT

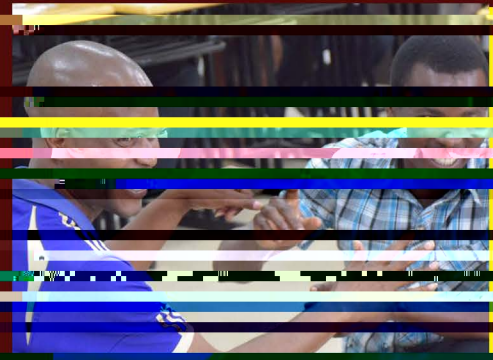

Glimpse into the business world

iPhone 7+, Bread, Physiotherapy sessions, Concrete and cattle. Ever been told the price of something and wondered "How in the world..."

IS THE PRICE RIGHT?

THE THEORY OF PRICING

There are 6 main methods by which prices are set by businesses:

1

MARK-UP PRICING

The most obvious form and common method used is to put a standard mark up on top of total costs. This method is used in every field and can be applied to almost everything. However, the standard mark-up often depends on the demand and/or supply of that item. A small seller can buy shoes at 10RMB in China and retail at 15RMB, because people can easily get the same shoe at the 10RMB price, the 5RMB is simply to cover transport and packing costs. However, the same shoe being sold in another country can be sold for 50 RMB because they may not easily get that same shoe and the extra costs of transport are more complex. This is simply how it can be explained.

2

TARGET-RETURN PRICING

A price that can yield a target profit on the investment; that means, it should be able to repay the investors for their investment. This is the pricing used for school fees, medical procedures and hotel services that have high fixed costs (buildings and equipment) and relatively low variable costs (Disposable swimming and gloves). Initial investment to provide a service is high and skills for them are extremely technical.

3

PERCEIVED VALUE PRICING

A price that reflects the value that the product will demonstrate to the customer or how it will reflect the status of the consumer to other people. This pricing is used for gadgets, cars, clothes, etc. Branded items and famous franchises use this too. Therefore, price of a designer shoe is what normal shoes do, but it is a reflection of its authenticity used and the name that will give you a good view from onlookers.

4

VALUE PRICING

This pricing is for low cost producers who maintain high quality. That is to say, the purpose of this does not lie in profit, but it is to show the producer has managed to provide excellent quality at a convenient price for the end consumer. This pricing is used by companies like Walmart that provide us our favourite daily necessities at very convenient prices.

5

GOING RATE PRICING

Prices that are based on competitors' prices. Normally smaller firms will follow or try to beat the price set by larger firms. This type is purely based on competition amongst sellers, and eventually it benefits the consumers. This is best demonstrated by the kind of competition on Taobao, where the smaller firms match and compete to beat prices of larger firms.

AUCTION-TYPE PRICING

When the buyers dictate the price they are willing to pay, and the sellers will compete with each other. This is known as an auction, where the price is set by customers through bids that companies send to the customer and he will decide on the most convenient.

I am a teacher. Teaching is something that I genuinely enjoy because I really feel like I'm making a difference. I enjoy the time I spend with my students and have always wanted to be one because my family has so many teachers. Also, I was always good at telling stories from the time I was in primary school. Career-wise, I am a Pharmacology teacher in the school of medicine and a researcher. I am currently pursuing a PhD and my research is focused on stem cell. I am also a wife and a mother.

The journey that led you to Jiangsu University (education & early career)?

I attended Zhenjiang. I then went on to study at China Pharmaceutical University in 1999. I then chose to pursue my master's degree in Pharmacology at the same university. I graduated in 2006 and joined Jiangsu University soon after. I chose pharmacy because I wanted to do something related to medicine and my parents were extremely encouraging, and helped me decide which field to go into since they were already healthcare personnel.

What would you say inspires you to keep learning?

Also, interact with as many people from other countries as you possibly can.

You're an accountant?
So what?

THE QUESTIONABLE RELEVANCE
OF AN ACCOUNTING DEGREE

What makes you think you matter? Look at the state of the world today. Technology is coming. Professions that were once thought bastions of job security are being felled left, right and center. First, it was the manual laborers in the mines, and then the blue-collar workers in factories, remember those who kept saying they couldn't be replaced because their jobs required "skills". Those skills couldn't save them. Employees in 'management' positions are being replaced by Amazon-like centers with software that collects, analyzes and reports in depth data on every worker's productivity in real time. Goodbye middle management. (Their technology is still proprietary but who knows how long that will last?) And now virtually no one is safe, even the medical profession is being encroached by the machines, just flip open you tube and you'll be inundated by the numerous videos of robots performing open heart surgery on some hapless lab rats. The evidence is abundant. Low value employees out, machines in.

The last words my father said to me as I was leaving Uganda were "learn as much as you can". Now those are mundane words, every parent says them. But one word in particular catches my fancy. "Learn". My father did not say "get taught as much as you can", he said learn as much as you can. Learning is more than just sitting in class and being lectured on the nuances of soil structure or the difference between beams and girders. There is more than a single way to learn (reading, being taught, apprenticeship, discussions, observation, meditation; the list goes on) but schools all over the world have settled into the comfortable way of sitting in front of a blackboard for 8 hours a day, 5 days a week. It's a mind-numbing routine that has its roots in cost saving. They know they should be doing more and yet they aren't. Their excuse? It's too expensive to educate you properly. The result? Graduates have very little value in the real world. They are incapable of educating themselves because they were trained to learn from a lecturer. They have no creativity, no unique skill sets, business acumen, self-drive or interpersonal skills. They are mere shells of what their graduation certificates are supposed to be.

Now, instead of accountants we have bookkeepers; instead of chemists, we have lab assistants; instead of pharmacists we have druggists. This is whose jobs the machines are taking over.

A quick Google search will tell you that accounting is one of the most desirable degrees in the world. Employment is plentiful and secure and salaries are stable if not rising. Accounting associations promote the major as being an alternative for a business-focused student. They call it accounting "the backbone of business" and tout accounting graduates as being in demand in all major business fields. However, at university specific career forums, accounting students are not so sure, and most of the worry is coming from the disparity between the advertised salaries and the actual salaries that accountants receive. In the United States the expected median salary for accountants is about \$55,000. But in reality, students are receiving offers of less than \$20,000 a year. This is exactly what is playing out the same in most countries.

What is the problem? Doesn't the world need accountants anymore? Of course, the world needs accountants. With a world economy that is growing at the rate of over 5 percent year on year, the world needs more accountants than ever, but it does not need you. It does not need another book keeper. It needs the business all-rounder, it was the industry values at 55 thousand a year.

Accounting

Most accounting graduates today cannot tell you the difference between a GDC and an ABS. They cannot tell you how to short sell a stock. (because that's not what accountants do, that you are part of the problem). This is why an accounting firm would rather hire a single systems analyst to design and manage their accounting software or dedicate millions to licensing proprietary technology from research firms than spend on recruiting more accounting graduates. That's why whenever companies announce that they are letting part of their staff go, their stock price usually rises. The software is more efficient and therefore valuable than the human employees.

The solution is simple, even obvious but make no mistake; it is not easy. Accounting students have to learn to survive and thrive without a corporate structure. They have to learn to start businesses around their skills or even outside of their areas of expertise. They must be able to make decisions on their own. They must learn to become more than mere tools within their industry because when a tool gets old, it joins the trash heap. This is an uphill task indeed about to change to accommodate current industry trends.

Now that you are privy to the idea, why you are valuable, how you will be directed and where the path to a more relevant future lies. What are you going to do about it? What are you going to do about it?
